About Us

Our program has been helping families since 2014 and is accredited by the Canadian Accreditation Council. The lodge can accommodate up to 6 families at a time.

Who We Serve

First Nations parents (male or female) that wish to attend addictions treatment accompanied by their children. Reducing the barriers to treatment and assisting in the preservation of the family unit.

Addictions Programming

The lodge's addictions treatment program is exclusively abstinence-based, due to the nature of the facility and the inclusion of children. The program draws on and explores the similarities between the 12-step programs of Alcoholics Anonymous/Narcotics Anonymous and traditional Indigenous teachings. The intention is to help those in recovery to achieve balanced living beyond sobriety, in a culturally safe manner. The program is delivered through an Indigenous worldview and engages participants to apply traditional teachings to their life within modern society. Intergenerational trauma and the history of Indigenous peoples in Canada are concepts examined. Grief, Loss, & Trauma counselling is provided to adults attending the program.

Personal Development Programming

Each parent will have an individualized programming plan to strengthen their knowledge, skills, and abilities in a safe and supportive environment. We offer a variety of modules adapted to be culturally relevant and align with the teachings of the medicine wheel, the seven grandfathers, and traditional culture including:

- Parenting
- Life Skills
- Homemaking
- Health & Wellbeing
- Education & Employment
